We've taken on community feedback and redesigned our unique pay-as-you-throw (PAYT) tag. It won't change things much for you. When and how you use a PAYT tag stays the same.

You can continue to use the old PAYT tags until they run out.

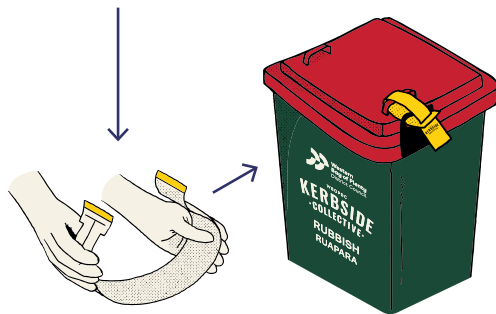
Our new PAYT tag is:

- ✓ Waterproof and stays attached in bad weather.
- ✓ Easily released when collected.
- ✓ Harder to fake.



How to apply the new tag:

1. Write your address on the tag.
2. Feed B end through the black and red handles on side of bin.
3. Open the cut at B and feed A end through.
4. Lock your tag in position at C.
5. Place bin facing the kerbside by 7am on your collection day.



Remember our top tips for a smooth kerbside collection

- Bins are out on the kerb by 7am and are left out until at least 7pm on your collection day. This is essential.
- All lids are fully closed.
- Bins and/or glass crate are not overfilled.
- Bin contents can fall freely into truck.
- If you're putting your red lid rubbish bin out, your pay-as-you-throw tag is attached and looped through both the red and black handles.
- There is a 30cm distance between large bins.
- Your bins and glass crate aren't in front of your letterbox. Most couriers will not deliver mail if the letterbox is not accessible.
