- Bubble wrap

- Plastic pesticide bottles - recycling number 1 or 2 in a triangle
- Plastic toys
- Plastics bottles and containers - recycling number 3-7 in triangle
- Plate glass (wrapped)
- Polystyrene
- Pringles chip tubes including lid
- PVC spouting
- Pyrex glass
- Ring binder/folder
- Rubber bands, hose
- Sanitary pads and tampons (wrap)
- Shopping bags, supermarket bags (excluding paper bags)
- Shrink wrap
- Smoke alarms
- Soft plastics (scrunchy plastics)
- Stripped wallpaper
- Takeaway cardboard containers (waxed)
- Tea bags - tea leaves removed

- Tetra packs (all kinds)

What goes in this bin

- Aerosol cans (empty)
- Aluminium cans (clean)
- Aluminium containers (clean)
- Baby formula tins (lid and scoop removed)
- Bioplastics (recycling number 1 and 2 only)
- Books (hard back)
- Books (soft cover)
- Brochures (remove wrapping)
- Cardboard (flattened)
- Catalogues (remove plastic wrapping)
- Cereal boxes (remove inside bag)
- Christmas wrapping paper (not cellophane or metallic)
- Egg cartons
- Janitorial plastic bottles - recycling number 1 or 2 only
- Junk mail - plastic wrapper removed
- Magazines
- Meat packing trays - plastics (# 1 or #2 in triangle)
- Milk bottles - plastic (rinsed and lids removed)
- Newspaper
- Paper - bags, brochures, pamphlets, flyers, junk mail, torn
- Paperback books
- Phonebooks
- Pizza Boxes (Little oil present with food scraps removed)
- Soft drink bottles - plastic, all colours
- Steel cans (clean)
- Takeaway plastic containers

What goes in this bin

- Alcohol bottles - RTDs, gin, whiskey (lids removed)
- Bottles, lids removed (wine, beer, kombucha)
- Glass bottles - brown, green, clear, brown, blue, opaque (no lids)
- Glass bottles and jars (food and beverage only, clean with no lids)

What goes in this bin

- Banana peel
- Bones (Beef, Chicken, Pork)
- Bread - mouldy, hard, crusts
- Coffee grinds
- Cooked food - leftovers, mouldy, rotten
- Cut flowers - dead, dried
- Dairy products - cheese, yogurt, sour cream
- Egg shells
- Fat - cooled or congealed
- Fish carcass and bones
- Food scraps
- Fruit peelings, pips & cores
- Kitchen paper towels
- Pasta, rice, leftover food
- Rotten meat or food
- Seafood shells - mussels, clams, scallops
- Tea leaves - bag and string removed
- Organic vacuum dust (pet hair and wool carpet) - no bits of plastic, glass or synthetic fibres
